
To explore what's changing in emergency preparedness and the roles and coordination of various entities, we invite you to join us for a private dinner meeting to exchange views with several industry leaders.

We will seek to better understand how the industry needs to respond regarding the inevitable increase in emergency preparation and how this might affect construction timelines.

This Roundtable is being planned for Tuesday October 25th, from 7:00 – 9:00 PM at the Ritz Carlton Hotel in Charlotte. This is an evening meeting following Day 1 of the *Nuclear Energy Insider* Nuclear Construction Summit.

Key Questions to Explore

- What is the role of federal, state and local governments in assuring emergency preparedness in the nuclear industry?
- What is the role of NEI, EPRI, INPO, WANO, the NRC?
- What is the role of the Operators?
- How will contractors and vendors participate?
- Review the importance of command and control during major catastrophes and the challenges if a whole area has to be evacuated.
