Today many new countries are investigating nuclear power to meet their burgeoning electricity demand.

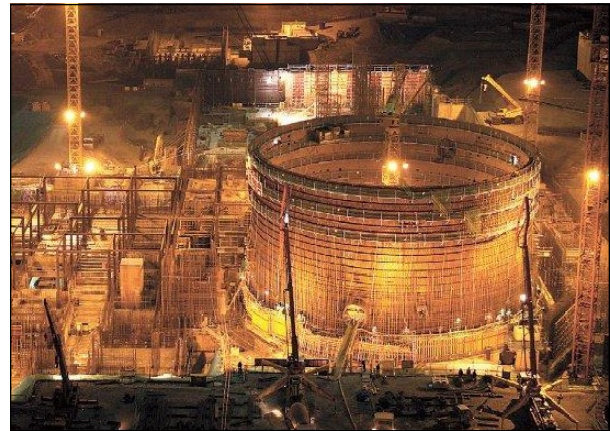
